Getting to know us!

Hi, My name is Tom, I am over retirement age and have lived all my life in east Belfast.

I meet with Christians at Newtownbreda Gospel hall. We meet each Sunday to remember the Lord, during the week we study the Bible, pray for each other and reach out to our neighbours that they may receive the joy of God's salvation as we have.



When I was young, my mother made sure that my sister and I went to Sunday School and children's meetings every week in Foundry Street Mission Hall, off the Newtownards Road. However at the age of 13, I refused to go any more to church. The first time my parents saw me drunk, I was only 15 years old. My mother quietly said to me the next day: "Son, I never want to see you like that again" and continued to pray for me.

When I was 16, I started an apprenticeship in Mackies on the Springfield Road. It wasn't too long until I was at the card school at lunch time, I was also using the same language as the men around me and drinking as much alcohol as I could.

In the year 1971 my father-in-law was very ill and I was left alone with him in the bedroom. I soon realised he was dying and my knees shook; I said to myself: "Someone should be here to talk to him about God."

Over the next year thoughts came to me about how I had acknowledged that there was a God, when my father-in-law was dying. Thoughts also came about Jesus and why He died and I realise now that God was speaking to me through these thoughts.

On 10th February 1972, I thought about God, how that Jesus is His son, He died at Calvary, He died for me, for my sins and my knees again shook as I felt that if I didn't get saved at that moment God might not ever speak to me again. It was then I asked God to save me, I put my trust in His Son who died for my sins and at that moment I was saved.

How can something so beautiful become so destroyed?

What happened in Belvoir forest is as old as Earth itself. God makes everything beautiful then along comes a disease that enters, corrupts and destroys all that was once lovely.

In the first book of the Bible, Genesis 1:31 we read: and God saw every thing that he had made, and behold, it was very good. How lovely was the creation then, even man whom God had made, was pleasing to God, they walked and talked together in harmony.

But just 5 chapters later in Genesis 6:5 we read: and God saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every imagination of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually and it repented the LORD that he had made man on the earth, and it grieved him at his heart. How very sad that what God had made lovely had been destroyed by Sin.

The forestry service had to take drastic action in Belvoir to deal effectively with the disease, P. ramorum; God also had to take drastic action to deal with Sin. That action did not result in cutting us down or in punishing us who had sinned for in John 3:17 we read: For God sent not his son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved.

At Calvary:

- Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures (1 Cor 15:3)
- By himself he purged our sins (Hebrews 1:3)
- He was manifested to take away our sins; in him is no sin (1 Jn 3:5)
- If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. (1 John 1:9)

The Forestry Service has a plan to restore the forest again and God also has a plan to restore us again by regeneration, a new birth, through new life by faith in Christ Jesus. (John 3:3, 7 & 16)



Wonders of Creation

Where are we going this year?

Without an atlas, road signs or Sat Nav, at least 4,000 species of birds make annual roundtrip migrations of thousands of miles, often returning to the exact same nesting and wintering locations from year to year. Much research has been carried out about how birds manage this amazing journey and the resulting answer is a very simple one: It's built in - they are just made that way!



Can I have a postcode please?

One of the greatest mysteries of migration is exactly how birds find their way from one location to the next. Scientific studies have been done on a number of bird species and different techniques of bird navigation have been discovered.

- Magnetic Sensing: Many birds have special chemicals or compounds in their brains, eyes or bills that help them sense the Earth's magnetic field. This helps the birds orient themselves for long journeys.
- Geographic Mapping: Because birds follow the same migration routes from year to year, their keen eyesight allows them to map their journey by different landforms and geographic features such as rivers, coastlines and mountain ranges.
- Star Orientation: For birds that migrate at night, star positions and the orientation of constellations can provide necessary navigation directions. During the day, birds also use the sun to navigate.
- Learned Routes: Some bird species, such as sandhill cranes and snow geese, learn migration routes from their parents and other adult birds in the flock. Once learned, younger birds can travel the route successfully themselves.

In Job 39:26 God asks Job the question:

Does the hawk fly by your wisdom, and spread its wings toward the south? Job was told by God that it was not man (nor by inference nature or evolution) that gave the hawk its ability to fly or its migration desires but it was God's wisdom, imparted to the hawk by creative design!

We are reminded of this great truth of a wise creator God in the book of Hebrews 3:4 For every house is built by someone, but He who built all things is God!
