Chitokoloki was as ready as it could be made for Covid-19. The conference centre is a repurposed leper colony; eighty small houses that were used to house lepers and other charity cases when leprosy was more common are being converted into a Bible conference centre. The houses are getting repaired to accommodate attendees and a new large dining hall and two washroom blocks were built. Chris was responsible for the plumbing. It was used for the first time this past week for a seminar for Christian camp counsellors.

We did take advantage of a three week gap in the flying schedule to have Flying Mission do some upgrades to the plane's avionics and also to do a top-end overhaul of the right side of the engine. It is a bit unnerving to see your engine spread all over the hangar and you wonder if it will ever go back together. But to the credit of the mechanics, it is back together and running very smoothly, with oil consumption reduced. We are thankful to the Lord for more than two thousand hours of safe flying out here.
