Dare to be different; Dare to be a Daniel

There is a book in the Bible called Daniel. It records the life and times of a man called Daniel who trusted God was in control of his life no matter what happened. In 1876 an American Sunday School teacher named Philip Paul Bliss wrote a song to help teach his students the book of Daniel. Some of you might remember singing it as a child:

Dare to be a Daniel,
Dare to stand alone!
Dare to have a purpose firm
Dare to make it known!

Daniel and his friends lived in tough times. They were captives in Babylon, life was difficult and their enemies were big. The reason we should dare to be a Daniel is because Daniel trusted that God was in control. The point of the story isn't Daniel's wisdom or his bravery but his faith: Daniel believed God was in charge of the universe and he acted accordingly. Daniel is a great role model for us today.

As the youngest of six children, I was born into a home full of activity, adventure and lots of noise! We lived just off Newton Park and I went to Cairnshill Primary School. My parents are Christians and so I was taught the Bible from before I could read. By the time I was five, I understood a lot about God - His greatness, His holiness, His love and ultimately how He became a man and died on the cross for the sin of the world 2000 years ago, then arose from the dead.




I became a Christian on a Sunday evening during 1995. It must have been one of the first times that I realized that I personally deserved God's judgment for my own sin and that I needed a Saviour. I remember bowing my head to pray to God. With simple faith, I agreed with God that I was a sinner heading for hell. But, then I thought about Jesus. I knew the Bible taught that God saves sinners who 'believe on the Lord Jesus Christ' (Acts 16:31). So, that's what I did. I trusted the Lord Jesus to forgive me, save me from punishment and bring me to heaven. Then I simply thanked God for saving me!

As I grew up, I started to question my faith. I remember sitting on the back step of our house wondering, 'why am I here?', 'is there really a God?' and, 'did Jesus really die and rise from the dead?' However again and again, my search for truth strengthened my faith.

I am convinced that the order and beauty of this universe points to a Designer - the Creator of the heavens and the earth (Gen 1:1). And I'm convinced that our moral instinct in knowing that the murder of the innocent is evil and that kindness is good can only be because a holy God has set a standard of right and wrong, and given us a conscience to know the difference.

As I have studied the books of the Bible, as well as ancient historians, I have discovered that there were hundreds of eyewitnesses who saw Jesus alive from the dead, over a period of forty days in many different places, and who were willing to suffer and die for this great truth - that Jesus is risen. And I have been amazed by the hundreds of fulfilled prophecies in the Old Testament (eg. Psalm 22, Isaiah 53) that prove the Bible to be the word of God.

Ultimately, I enjoy a personal experience of God. Through Jesus Christ, I now have peace with God. I have a certain hope for eternity and I have a new purpose for this life. My prayer is that many others will also enjoy relationship with the Living God by coming as sinners to Jesus Christ and trusting Him to be their Saviour and Lord.

Can you imagine what would happen if you found a book that recorded all of your family history and gave an account of their sin, rebellion and failure to keep their word. 



Wonders of Creation Dragonfly



Dragonflies have long been known to be exquisite fliers. They can track other insects with incredibly intricate manoeuvring that makes them appear stationary to their target.

Insects' compound eyes are good at detecting the slightest motion, so the flight patterns must have amazing control systems. Appearing stationary would be very useful for sneaking up on other insects or for eluding a predator. How can the dragonfly perform aerial acrobatics like flying backwards or forwards, fast, slow or hovering and remain airborne for such extended periods?

The answer, in part, is that it has four wings.

While many flying insects use only a single pair of wings, dragonflies can move each of their four wings independently, which is a key factor in their ability to perform astonishing acrobatics.

What's more, dragonflies have the flexibility to switch between out-ofphase flapping and in-phase flapping as appropriate. When taking off, for example, dragonflies synchronise their wing beats, thus they are able to lift and accelerate better than if they used only two wings.



A brief report in the New Scientist (2003) said, 'Dragonflies can overshadow their enemies in complex manoeuvres that military fighter pilots only dream of.'

It really defies reason to suggest that an energy-efficient aerial acrobat such as the dragonfly was not intentionally, and intelligently, designed.
